

To enroll in Idaho Job Corps, applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- a. Be at least 16, but not yet 25 years old, on the date of arrival at a Job Corps center (i.e. time of enrollment). For otherwise eligible individuals with disabilities, the maximum age limit may be waived (minimum age is still 16).
- b. Have a signed consent form for automatic Selective Service registration (for male applicants) or proof of prior enrollment.
- c. Be a United States Citizen, a United States National, a lawfully admitted permanent resident alien, refugee, asylee or parolee, or other alien who has been authorized by the Attorney General to work in the United States.
- d. Must have all court, including traffic, fines paid. Must not have any outstanding court obligations, including face-to-face probation or parole if applying for residential services.
- e. Must be a low-income individual. Income for juveniles is determined by their parent’s earnings. Students with documented disabilities are a “family of one” and income is considered accordingly.

- f. Be an individual who is one or more of the following:
  - a. A school dropout (or potential dropout)
  - b. An individual who requires additional education, vocational training, or intensive career counseling and related assistance, in order to participate successfully in regular schoolwork or to secure and hold employment
  - c. Basic skills deficient
  - d. Homeless, runaway, or foster child
  - e. A parent

Please note that income is not a component in determining eligibility for an applicant who\*:

- a. Receives cash welfare payments, such as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or general assistance, or food stamps; or
- b. Is a member of a family living in a single residence which receives cash welfare payments, such as TANF or general assistance, or food stamps; or
- c. Is a foster child for whom state or local government payments are made, or a ward of the state or court

***\*if a, b, or c apply, the applicant must provide documentation of qualification***
