Our Next Chapter: Strategic Plan 2025-2030

In November 2024, North Idaho College launched a comprehensive process to chart its future. Over the course of several months, the college gathered both quantitative data and qualitative insights through surveys, listening sessions, and community engagement. This inclusive effort drew on the perspectives of students, faculty, staff, and partners across the region.

The result is a five-year strategic plan that sets a clear vision for the future of NIC. Adopted by the Board of Trustees in May 2025, the plan is anchored in five strategic goals supported by 16 objectives, with concrete action steps and timelines for implementation. Beginning in Fall 2025, the plan will guide decision-making, align resources, and measure progress in ways that directly benefit students and the communities NIC serves.

How We Got Here

A Strategic Planning Steering Committee, comprised of campus and community representatives, led the development of the plan. Through its work, NIC identified key priorities, refined objectives, and established mechanisms for accountability. Each objective has a designated lead, measurable outcomes, and a timeline for progress. Updates will be shared in regular NIC Board of Trustee meetings to ensure transparency and community trust.

Looking Ahead

The Strategic Plan 2025-2030 is more than an internal roadmap—it is a commitment to student success, workforce readiness, and community impact. It positions NIC to respond to evolving educational needs and regional priorities with agility and focus.

As this plan launches in Fall 2025, NIC looks forward to advancing partnerships, investing in student services, and creating pathways that empower learners to thrive. Together, with the support of our community, we are building the next chapter of North Idaho College's legacy of excellence.

Strengthening Our Economy, Supporting Our Community

North Idaho College continues to be a powerful driver of economic growth in the region. A recent study found that in fiscal year 2023–24, NIC generated \$273.2 million in economic impact, the equivalent of supporting nearly 4,000 jobs in its five-county service area.

Much of this impact comes from former students who are now part of the regional workforce, contributing more than \$205 million in added income. College operations, student spending, and the ripple effect of NIC's presence add tens of millions more each year. In fact, one out of every 39 jobs in the region is connected to the college and its students.

The benefits extend beyond wages and business activity. Taxpayer savings and added revenue totaled \$38.1 million in the past year alone.

For every dollar invested in NIC, the community receives an estimated \$4.50 in return, underscoring the value of higher education as both an individual and collective investment.



North Idaho College's impact is clear: the college not only transforms lives through education, but also strengthens the economy, supports families, and fuels the future of the region.

Program Highlights

Outdoor Recreation Leadership

NIC's Outdoor Recreation Leadership program is one of the most unique programs in the state, offering students immersive training in leadership, environmental education, and recreation management. With North Idaho's lakes, rivers and mountains as a classroom, graduates are prepared for careers in guiding, parks, youth programs and outdoor education.



Nursing (RN)

North Idaho College's Associate Degree Nursing program is recognized as Idaho's top-ranked RN program, preparing graduates to meet the region's growing health care needs. Of Idaho's 13 nursing schools, NIC's ranks No. 1 in pass rates on the first attempt on the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) licensure examination. With strong clinical partnerships and a curriculum grounded in patient-centered care, teamwork, and evidence-based practice, NIC nursing graduates consistently achieve excellent NCLEX pass rates and are in high demand across the state.







NIC's Graphic and Web Design students regularly earn top regional honors and professional recognition for design projects benefiting nonprofits and community organizations. With an emphasis on portfolio development and real-world client work, graduates leave prepared for careers in digital media, graphic design, and marketing.



Cybersecurity and Information Security Administration (INFOSEC)

NIC's INFOSEC program equips students with the technical expertise to defend against today's growing cyber threats. With a curriculum that emphasizes both theory and applied security, graduates are prepared for in-demand roles in information technology, system administration, and network security.



Culinary Arts

North Idaho College's Culinary Arts program blends classic training with innovation, preparing chefs for restaurants, food trailers and more. Students in the program operate Emery's restaurant, a unique lab that provides them a space to practice their skills by providing delicious, creative and industry-quality meals to the community. Students can also take advantage of NIC's new apprenticeship program, which connects them with local kitchens for hands-on experience that blends classroom instruction and paid on-the-job training.



Theatre

NIC's Theatre program offers students the opportunity to perform, design, and direct in a dynamic learning environment that includes mainstage productions open to the community each semester as well as other student-led projects. With dedicated faculty and hands-on experience in acting, stagecraft, and production, students develop skills that transfer to both professional theatre and a wide range of creative fields.

Autobody and Paint Technology

North Idaho College's Autobody and Paint Technology program equips students for careers in collision repair and refinishing. The nine-month program gives students hands-on experience in gas metal arc welding, plastic and fiberglass repair, sheet metal replacement, damage analysis, refinishing techniques and more. Graduates are prepared for entry-level positions in the automotive repair industry.

Radiography Technology

North Idaho College's Radiography Technology program prepares students for skilled imaging careers with entry-level employment as radiographers. All 2025 graduates passed the national board exam on their first attempt, with six scoring in the 99th percentile or higher compared to the 79% national average. Nearly all graduates secured employment before graduation, beginning their careers at local hospitals and clinics.

Surgical Technology

North Idaho College's Surgical Technology program prepares students for highdemand roles in hospital operating rooms, surgery centers, and specialty clinics. The program has maintained a five-year pass rate of nearly 99 percent on the national certification exam, far above the 67 percent national average, and was recently ranked the top program in Idaho by College Factual. Students receive classroom, lab and clinical experience. Nearly all secure employment before graduation.

Student-athletes shine during seasons, in class, in the community

From sports to studies to service, North Idaho College student-athletes rose to the occasion in 2024-2025.

Seasons of Success

Cardinals competed with pride and purpose:

- Women's Soccer earned a third seed in the Region 18
 Championships and had four athletes selected to the SWAC All-Region Team.
- Men's Soccer earned a Top 20 national ranking and a third seed in the Region 18 Championships, with nine athletes selected for SWAC All-Region honors.
- Volleyball finished with two SWAC All-Region selections.
- Wrestling secured three All-Americans and finished eighth at nationals.
- Women's Basketball finished 17-13, earning a fourth seed to Region 18 Championships and two SWAC All-Region picks.
- Men's Basketball finished 18-13, earning a Region 18 Championship berth as the third seed and placing two players on the SWAC All-Region team.
- Softball earned a Region 18 Championship berth as the fourth seed with two players selected to the SWAC All-Region team.









NIC had 56 student-athletes recognized by the National Junior College Athletic Association on its 2024-25 All-Academic Teams, including seven on the First Team (4.0 GPA), 20 on the Second Team (GPAs between 3.8 and 3.99) and 29 on the Third Team (GPAs between 3.6 and 3.79).

Giving Back

In the community, Cardinal student-athletes inspired young learners by reading to elementary school students and nurtured future athletes at youth camps and clinics. They participated in the Autism Walk, pitched in at the NIC Beach Clean-Up, volunteered with Brighter Life Foundation and CoPow Foods as well as at the regional Special Olympics. They made Christmas crafts with students at Winton Elementary, handed out food to those in need during the holidays and walked in the St. Paddy's Day Parade downtown.

Boosting Athletics

The North Idaho Booster Club Board is the largest it's been in several years. Members are reinvigorated and very active about supporting the athletic program. To sign up or for more information, visit *nicboosters.org*.



NIC Workforce Training Center

North Idaho College Workforce Training provides demand-driven, industry-specific learning opportunities that empower students to achieve economic self-sufficiency, enhance business productivity, and contribute to community prosperity.

The center offers hundreds of courses and serves thousands of students each year. In 2025, NIC Workforce Training had 8,038 class enrollments and served 5,382 students.

Programs offered include apprenticeships in construction, electrical, HVAC, plumbing, heavy equipment, airframe and powerplant mechanic, and logging equipment operation. Health and emergency services training includes CNA, medical assistant, phlebotomy, firefighter, EMT, and more. Other options include CDL, flagger and forklift certifications, driver's education, welding, and a wide range of business and leadership courses.

NIC Workforce Training courses are non-credit and lead to licensure or certification. They are designed to launch or advance careers through the delivery of short-term, high-quality, accessible, affordable training.

Several NIC Workforce Training programs allow students to turn their non-credit training into a degree. The following NIC Workforce Training courses can be transcribed for credit, at no cost to the student, and applied toward a North Idaho College associate degree: Plumbing, Electrical, HVAC, Heavy Equipment Operator and Construction apprenticeships, Phlebotomy, and Firefighter 1 Academy. Additional general education courses are required to complete the degree.

The NIC Workforce Training Center is based in Post Falls in the Riverbend Commerce Park. Classes are offered at the center in Post Falls, at the North Idaho College Parker Technical Education Center in Rathdrum, and in Sandpoint for programs such as Commercial Driver's License (CDL), welding, and health careers.
