# NIC Workforce Training hosts inaugural trades apprenticeship graduation ceremony

To the strains of "Pomp and Circumstance," 83 apprentices walked into the North Idaho College Workforce Training Center's first-ever trades apprenticeship graduation ceremony.

With some graduates still in work boots and uniforms from their jobs in electrical, plumbing, and HVAC—it was a powerful reminder of the real-world experiences that brought them to this moment.

A large audience of family, employers, and mentors came together for the June 5 ceremony in the NIC Schuler Performing Arts Center in Coeur d'Alene. The event marked the apprentices' completion of four years of rigorous training, which prepared them to take the exam to become licensed journeymen.

"The knowledge and skills you have acquired here will open doors to countless opportunities. Embrace the challenges that come your way, for they are the steppingstones to success," said NIC President Nick Swayne to the graduates during his keynote speech. "Continue to seek knowledge, innovate, and strive for excellence in everything you do. The world is in need of your talents, and I have no doubt that you will make a significant impact in your respective industries."

development, told the graduates that when they began this journey, it wasn't just about learning a trade or building a skill.

"It was about making a commitment—to show up, to work hard, to ask questions, to keep learning even when it was challenging, and to keep going even when it wasn't glamorous. And you did all of that—and more," Mattila said.

As apprentices, the graduates balanced full-time work—comprising thousands of hours of on-the-job training—with evening or weekend classes at the center.

There were 137 electrical, plumbing, and HVAC apprentices eligible to participate in the inaugural graduation ceremony, a reflection of the size of the NIC Workforce Training Center's apprenticeship program, which is the second-largest in Idaho behind the College of Western Idaho in the Boise area.

The NIC Workforce Training Center has roughly 1,000 apprentices participating annually in its trades apprenticeship programs.

During the graduation ceremony, Vicki Isakson, NIC dean of workforce education, reminded the graduates of the importance of their chosen professions.

"These are careers with staying power and purpose," Isakson said.

Apprenticeship training at the NIC Workforce Training Center also offers program graduates an academic pathway, should they wish to continue their educational journey at North Idaho College. NIC Workforce Training apprentices' noncredit learning can be transcribed into North Idaho College credits, positioning these students to earn an associate of applied science degree if they successfully complete five NIC courses.

President Swayne and Mattila told the apprenticeship graduates NIC was offering them each a \$1,000 scholarship to help them continue their education.

"The future is yours to shape, and I am confident that you will do so with integrity, innovation, and unwavering commitment," Swayne said.

# From NIC Workforce Training to NIC degree path Hard work pays off for Sam Karst

Sam Karst is 21 and already on her way to a rewarding career in dental health.

As a high school senior, she enrolled in the Dental Assisting program at North Idaho College's Workforce Training Center through Idaho's Advanced Opportunities program, which allows students to take career-focused courses.

"I had always been interested in the dental field," Karst said. "By the second semester of my senior year, I was able to enroll in the program while still in high school."

Balancing school sports, a job, and night classes wasn't easy.

"I still wanted to be involved in school activities, but it was tough to juggle everything," she said. "I overcame it by staying organized and focused on my goals."

After completing the program, Karst worked as a dental assistant at the Pediatric Dental Center of North Idaho for more than two years.



"What I appreciated most was the chance to start a career I was genuinely interested in even before graduating high school," she said. "I also had a wonderful experience with my NIC Workforce Training instructor, Emily Penberthy, whose passion for the dental field was really inspiring."

Six months into the job, she knew she wanted to advance her career.

While working full-time, Karst completed prerequisites for the Dental Hygiene Program at NIC. She started in January 2025 and is on track to graduate in December 2026.

"My Workforce Training Center experience gave me the confidence to keep going," she said.

Now studying to become a registered dental hygienist, Karst hopes to make a lasting impact on her patients' health.

# **Answering the Call NIC Firefighter 1 Academy Graduation**

"Your impact on the lives of others matters."

That was the message Coeur d'Alene Fire Deputy Chief Bill Deruyter shared with the North Idaho College Firefighter 1 Academy Class of 2025 during their May graduation.

"The calls you respond to matter to the people you serve," he told the 16 graduates. "No matter how small you think the call is, it is big for those that call for us."

Deruyter reminded the class that firefighting is a calling rooted in service and purpose. NIC President Nick Swayne echoed that sentiment.

"Firefighting is more than a profession — it's a calling," he said. "It requires physical strength, mental resilience, and a deep sense of duty."

Over several months, students undergo intensive training to prepare for fire service careers. The program includes smoke-filled environment navigation, hazardous materials response, and more. Graduates are eligible to take the national certification exam through the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC).

Launched in 2010, the academy is a partnership between NIC Workforce Training and local fire agencies. It is sponsored by Coeur d'Alene Fire Department and supported by instructors from multiple departments.





"The Firefighter 1 Academy is that first step in starting a career as a firefighter," said Marty Matney, program manager. "Our graduates have been hired throughout the Northwest."

Applications for the January 2026 academy will be accepted Oct. 13-Nov. 2.

# **Heavy Equipment Apprenticeship Year 1**

Heavy equipment operators provide the necessary skills for any project that requires moving and transporting heavy materials or any kind of earthmoving. Operators work on regular construction building jobs, as well as in infrastructure (roads, bridges, and ports), mining, and timber.
